LEADERSHIP TRAINING NEW PROGRAM

We had a very successful start to our renewed Leadership Training Classes held this week via video conference calls and Cogwa.TV. We had a total of 35 men from all 3 congregations participating in the training sessions.

NEW FOI PROJECT – RALEIGH AND HICKORY

For our next FOI project, we are asking for participation in a food and personal care item donation drive for Interact, a charitable organization that provides shelter and aid to victims of domestic violence. Interact is "dedicated to ending the cycle of domestic and sexual violence in Wake County North Carolina" by providing 24 hr crisis lines, emergency shelter, court advocacy, counseling, children's services, as well as other services. Among some of the most needed items are:

- Toilet paper (small packages of 2 - 4 rolls)
- Paper towels (small packages of 2 - 4 rolls)
- Ready to eat meals (such as Hormel compleats, ramen noodles, etc)
- Healthy individually wrapped snacks
- Canned fruit
- Cereal
- Jelly

They say they do not need canned vegetables. We were told they prefer the donations to come in plastic shopping bags, since they are able to put these bags to good use as well.

TRIP TO ISRAEL IN 2024?

FI Exploring Possible 2024 Israel Trip

Foundation Institute is currently exploring the possibility of a travel education tour to Israel in the spring of 2024. The trip would take place from May 28 to June 4, 2024.

The trip would follow an itinerary similar to those of our past Israel trips, starting in the northern part of Israel and ending in the city of Jerusalem.

We would tour on an air-conditioned coach with a professional Israeli guide and historian. Sabbath services would be held in the city of Jerusalem. At this point, we are planning for a group of 45-50 participants, depending on interest.

The group would likely fly out of New York City on Tuesday, May 28, and return on Wednesday, June 5.

We cannot yet lock in airfares for 2024, so we can't announce an exact cost of the trip, but we expect that the double-occupancy price would be around **\$3,500** per person (to include airfare, hotels, two meals a day, site entrance fees and other costs associated with the trip). We estimate the single-occupancy price would be around **\$4,500**.

NEW OPERATIONS DEPARTMENT ANNOUNCED BY HQ

From Mr. Jim Franks.....

With the initiation of the International Leadership Program, I have been able to visit all the international areas over the past six years. It has truly been a learning experience for me and the others here in the office. There are a number of leadership needs that have become obvious during our travels. We have also received numerous requests for more involvement by the office here in the United States in the international areas.

Our documents give the president oversight responsibility for the congregations, wherever they might be located; so, after considerable discussion with international liaison Leon Walker, the current management team and the Ministerial Board of Directors (MBOD), I have made the decision to add an operation manager for the international work of the Church. This individual will be tasked with advancing the International Leadership Program around the world.

Mr. Walker has requested to step down as international liaison in favor of this new position, operation manager for the international work of the Church, or simply international director. Mr. Walker will remain as regional director of the Spanish-speaking areas of the Church.

After discussing this with the current management team of the Church (Doug Horchak, operation manager for Ministerial Services; Clyde Kilough, operation manager for Media; and Britton Taylor, operation manager for Finances), I have made the decision to nominate Mr. Horchak as the new

operation manager for the international work, or international director. Mr. Horchak has been approved by the MBOD to take on this responsibility immediately.

There is now a need to appoint a new operation manager for Ministerial Services. My plan is to nominate a new operation manager for Ministerial Services in the next few weeks—an appointment that will also need approval by the MBOD. Mr. Horchak will continue in both jobs (operation manager for the International Work and operation manager for Ministerial Services) until a replacement for the Ministerial Services position is approved by the MBOD. As he takes on the new position of international director, Mr. Horchak will continue to serve here at the headquarters office as a member of the administration and management team for the Church.
